Spiritual Notes:

In today's Mass we focus on the gift of the Eucharist. The reading from Exodus narrates a sacrificial meal shared between Moses and the elders and the Lord. Their participation in the meal indicates that the Israelites agree to enter into a covenant relationship with the Lord. The blood sprinkled on the altar and the people signifies the ratification of the covenant binding the two parties together. For Christians, the celebration of the Eucharist is seen as the "new covenant" established by Jesus; we are united with God through our sharing in this meal. The covenant ceremony in Exodus prefigures the Christian Eucharist. The author of the Letter to the Hebrews says that Christ entered into the sanctuary and acquired our eternal redemption by the price of his blood. The earlier covenant made with Moses and the Israelites provided for ongoing sacrifices "with the blood of goats and calves"; no, Christ is "mediator of a new covenant" which leads to "the promised eternal inheritance." His death is once for all; his sacrifice makes him mediator of a new covenant that reconciles us to God. In Mark's Gospel today, Jesus institutes the Eucharist at the Last Supper. During the course of the meal, he takes, blesses, breaks, and gives the bread to his disciples, stating, "This is my body." Similarly, with the cup he says, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed," anticipating his upcoming crucifixion. The phrase "for many" actually means "for all"; it is a translation of an inclusive Semitic figure of speech. Our English translation, though literal, does not capture Jesus' intention. His blood is shed for all. His sacrifice has implications for the whole world. Taking place within the context of the feast of Passover, Jesus' Last Supper is understood as inaugurating a "new covenant."

For reflection: How has my understanding of the Eucharist grown over the years? how does my reception of the Eucharist impact my life?

Notas Espirituales:

En la Misa de hoy nos centramos en el don de la Eucaristía. La lectura del Éxodo narra una comida de sacrificio compartido entre Moisés, los ancianos y el SEÑOR. Su participación en la comida indica que los israelitas están de acuerdo en entrar en una relación de pacto con el SEÑOR. La sangre rociada sobre el altar y el pueblo significa la ratificación de la unión de las dos partes juntas. Para los cristianos, la celebración de la Eucaristía es visto como el “nuevo pacto” establecido por Jesús; estamos unidos con Dios a través de nuestra participación en esta comida.

La ceremonia del pacto en Éxodo prefigura la Eucaristía Cristiana.

El autor de la Carta a los Hebreos dice que Cristo “... entró en el santuario” y adquirió nuestra “redención eterna” por el precio de su sangre. El pacto anterior hecho con Moisés y los israelitas proveían sacrificios continuos “con sangre de machos cabríos y de becerros”; Ahora, Cristo es “mediador de un nuevo pacto”, que conduce a “la herencia eterna prometida.” Su muerte es “una vez para siempre”; su sacrificio de “mediador de un nuevo pacto” que nos hace reconciliarnos con Dios.

En el Evangelio de hoy de Marcos, Jesús instituye la Eucaristía en la Última Cena. Durante el transcurso de la comida, toma, bendice, parte, y le da el pan a sus discípulos, diciendo: “Este es mi cuerpo”. Del mismo modo, con la copa, él dice, “Esta es mi sangre de la alianza, que será derramada”, anticipando su próxima crucifixión. La frase “por muchos” en realidad significa “para todos”; es una traducción de una figura semita inclusiva de expresión. Nuestra traducción Inglés, aunque literal, no capta la intención de Jesús. Su sangre es derramada por todos. Su sacrificio tiene implicaciones para el mundo entero. Teniendo lugar en el contexto de la fiesta de la Pascua, la Última Cena de Jesús se entiende como la inauguración de una “nueva alianza.”

Para reflexionar: ¿Cómo ha crecido mi entendimiento de la Eucaristía a través de los años? ¿Cómo al recibir la Eucaristía afecta mi vida?
