## Spiritual Notes:

Wisdom is personified in the Old Testament world as a woman. Alongside Folly, also depicted as a woman, Wisdom invites people to join her in a banquet. She extends her invitation to join her in her house, one with "seven columns," an image implying greatness. Her invitation is extended to "whoever is simple or lacks understanding," that they might learn from her benefit. To dwell in her house is to "advance in the way of understanding." And so her's is an invitation worth considering. To choose Wisdom over Folly is to choose the way of God and the way of life. In John's Gospel today we continue to hear Jesus' Bread of Life discourse. Jesus declares himself to be "the living bread that came down from heaven" which is "my flesh for the life of the world." Whereas the manna in the wilderness was only for the Israelites, Jesus' gift will nourish the whole world. But the crowd does not understand Jesus and asks, "How can this man give us flesh to eat?" But John's audience knows that this bread is a reference to the Eucharist, which is sharing in the body and blood of Christ. As Jesus has "life because of the Father," whoever "feeds on me will have life because of me." Our union with Christ unites us to the Father. The letter to the Ephesians continues to call us to live lives worthy of our Baptism - "not as foolish persons but as wise." Our author warns us, "The days are evil" so we must strive to live as God calls us to live, "filled with the Spirit." As Christians, our lives ought to be in conformity with God's will.

*For reflection: Do I believe the Eucharist is intended "for the life of the world?" Do I seek to dwell in the house of Wisdom?*

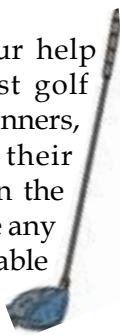

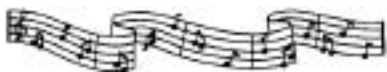

#### Notas Espirituales:

La sabiduría está personificada en el mundo del Antiguo Testamento como una mujer. Junto a la locura, también representada como una mujer, la Sabiduría invita a la gente a unirse a ella en un banquete. Ella extiende su invitación a unirse a ella en su casa, una con "siete columnas", una grandeza que implica imagen. Su invitación se extiende a "todo el que es simple... (o) carece de entendimiento", para que puedan aprender de ella y sus beneficio. Para habitar en su casa es "avanzar en el camino de la inteligencia". Y así, la suya es una invitación vale la pena considerar. Para elegir la sabiduría sobre la locura es elegir el camino de Dios y de la forma de vida.

En el Evangelio de Juan hoy seguimos escuchando el discurso de Pan de Vida de Jesús. Jesús declara a sí mismo como "el pan vivo que ha bajado del cielo", que es "mi carne para la vida de la palabra". Considerando que el maná en el desierto era sólo para los israelitas, el regalo de Jesús alimenta al mundo entero. Pero la multitud no entiende a Jesús y le pregunta: "¿Cómo puede éste darnos de comer su carne? Pero el pueblo de Juan sabe que este pan es una referencia a la Eucaristía, que es una participación en el cuerpo y la sangre de Cristo. Como Jesús tiene "la vida por el Padre," el que "se alimenta de mí tendrá vida por mí". Nuestra unión con Cristo nos une al Padre.

La carta a los Efesios nos sigue llamando a vivir una vida digna de nuestro bautismo: "personas no como necios sino sabios". Nuestro autor nos advierte: "Los días son malos", por lo que debemos esforzarnos por vivir como Dios nos llama a la vida, "llenos del Espíritu".
