Spiritual Notes:

The readings for today's Mass help prepare us for the liturgical celebrations of the upcoming week. In Isaiah, we hear the suffering servant speak of his mission from the "Lord God"; the servant has received "a well-trained tongue" in order to speak a word to the weary "that will rouse them." The open ear is a sign of the servant's willing acceptance of his vocation. But the people's response to the preaching of the servant is persecution: his back is beaten, his beard is town out, and he suffers "buffets and spitting." But "the Lord God is my help....I shall not be put to shame." Reflection on this text; it is easy to understand how the early Church saw this text as a prophecy of Jesus's suffering. Paul writes to the Philippians about Jesus's self emptying, "taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness." Here he is talking about the second person of the Trinity, who "humbled himself, becoming obedient to...death on a cross." Unlike Adam and Eve, who sought to reach beyond their limits, he "did not regard equality with God something to be grasped." Because of this, God greatly exalted him. We know that beyond the cross, there is an empty grave. Jesus's entry into Jerusalem begins the final act of His mission. Much of Luke's Gospel has taken place during "his journey up to Jerusalem." Riding into Jerusalem on a colt - an animal of peace, not war - Jesus is greeted by the people, who proclaim Him "the king who comes in the name of the Lord." But at the same time "some of the Pharisees in the crowd" object and call Him to silence His disciples. So the stage is set as those who acclaim Jesus and those who reject Him gather in Jerusalem for the coming fest that will bring about the salvation of the world.

For reflection: How does Jesus's example of humility serve as an example for me? How can I better participate in this upcoming Holy Week?

Spiritual Works of Mercy: Fifth spiritual work of mercy - bearing wrongs patiently. Humanly speaking, this may be one of the spiritual works of mercy that is most difficult to observe. (1 Cor. 13:4, 7) Fostering an attitude of patience should encourage us to reflect on our own behavior, seeking to discover within us that which is also annoying and unbearable, not only for ourselves, but also for those we interact with. In this way, we can grow in the spiritual perfection that Jesus calls 11s to.

"Vía Crucis" significado es "Camino de la Cruz." También conocido como "Estaciones de la Cruz" y "Vía Dolorosa." Se trata de un acto de piedad, un camino de oración que busca con la meditación de la pasión y muerte de Jesucristo en su camino al Calvario.

<u>Vía crucis "Estaciones de la Crus"</u> <u>Marzo 18</u> 8:00 p.m. en Español

Grupo "Corazón de María": Todas las mujeres están invitadas a participar cada viernes, de 11:00 a.m. a 2:00 p.m., en este grupo para Oración, Evangelización, clases de Inglés, labores del hogar y consejos prácticos para la vida.

El "*Grupo de hombres*" se reúne todos los viernes en Family Life 7:30 p.m. (en el edificio nuevo en frente de la Iglesia San José).

Notas Espirituales:

Las lecturas de la misa de hoy nos ayuda a prepararnos para la celebración litúrgica de la próxima semana. En Isaías escuchamos el sufrimiento del sirviente que habla de su misión del "Señor Dios"; el sirviente ha recibido "una lengua bien entrenada" con el fin de decir una palabra al abatido "que se anime." El oído abierto es una señal de aceptación voluntaria del sirviente de su vocación. Pero la respuesta del pueblo a la predicación del sirviente es la persecución: la espalda es golpeada, su barba es arrancada, y sufre "insultos y salivazos." Pero "el Señor Dios es mi ayuda ... no se someterán a la vergüenza." Al reflexionar sobre este texto, es fácil entender cómo la iglesia primitiva vio este texto como una profecía del sufrimiento de Jesús. Pablo escribe a los Filipenses acerca de la auto-vaciamiento de Jesús, "tomando la forma de siervo, haciéndose semejante a los humanos." Aquí se está hablando de la segunda persona de la Trinidad, que "se humilló a sí mismo., Haciéndose obediente hasta la muerte ... en una cruz." A diferencia de Adán y Eva, que trató de llegar más allá de sus límites, que "no estimó el ser igual a Dios como algo a ser comprendido." "Debido a esto, Dios lo engrandeció." Sabemos que más allá de la cruz, hay una tumba vacía. La entrada de Jesús en Jerusalén comienza el acto final de su misión. Gran parte del Evangelio de Lucas ha tenido lugar durante "su viaje a Jerusalén." La entrada a Jerusalén montado en un asno - un animal de la paz, no de guerra - Jesús es recibido por el pueblo, que lo proclama "el rey que viene en el nombre del Señor." Pero, al mismo tiempo, "algunos de los fariseos de entre la multitud" a propósito lo llaman para silenciar a sus discípulos. Así se prepara el escenario como aquellos que aclaman a Jesús y los que rechazan a él se reúnen en Jerusalén para la fiesta que viene que traerá la salvación del mundo.

Para la reflexión: ¿Cómo ejemplo de humildad de Jesús servir como un ejemplo para mí? ¿Cómo puedo participar mejor en los acontecimientos de este próximo Semana Santa?
