### Spiritual Notes:

Today's reading from Isaiah comes from what is traditionally called Trito-Isaiah. Written by an anonymous prophet in the line of Isaiah, it addresses the postexilic community back in their homeland. Written with a universal perspective, the text anticipates "foreigners who join themselves to the Lord." Membership within the community of God's people is not about bloodlines as much as His covenant. They are the ones who will be gathered on God's "holy mountain," Jew and gentile alike, for God's house is to be "a house of prayer for all peoples." Paul describes himself as the apostle to the Gentiles in the letter to the Romans. He sees his mission to them as a way of making his race jealous which will lead to some of them being saved. The conversion of the gentiles, who have "disobeyed God, but have now received mercy" will serve to lead the Jews who have disobeyed to also receive mercy of God extended to all. Jesus' encounter with the Canaanite woman finds him in foreign territory, among gentiles. The woman approaches Jesus pleading for help for her daughter who is tormented by a demon. She is persistent in her request even in the face of Jesus's preliminary refusal, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." But she reminds him that "even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of their masters." She is not looking to take anything away from the Jews; she is merely looking for help for her daughter. Her perseverance pays off, as Jesus heals her daughter in response to her great faith. God's grace and mercy are intended for all who seek them.

For reflection: How does an "us against them" mentality reflect an attitude contrary to Christianity? Who are those who are overlooked today, and how can we as church assist them in experiencing God's grace and mercy?

Please keep in your prayers, Al Kopec, age 85, who died on Monday, August 14, 2017. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. Please also keep Marie and all of Al's family and friends in your prayers.

## Get Involved in Music Ministry!

#### Notas Espirituales:

La lectura de hoy de Isaías viene de lo que tradicionalmente se llama Trito-Isaías. Escrito por un profeta anónimo a la línea de Isaías, se dirige a la comunidad después de exilio de nuevo en su tierra natal. Escrito con una perspectiva universal, el texto prevé que "los extranjeros que sigan al SEÑOR." La membrecía en la comunidad del pueblo de Dios no se trata de líneas de sangre tanto como se trata de guardar los mandamientos y la celebración "de mi alianza." Ellos son los que se reunirán en el "monte santo" de Dios - Judío y gentiles por igual - para la casa de Dios será "una casa de oración para todos los pueblos". Pablo describe a sí mismo como "el apóstol de los gentiles" en la carta a los Romanos. Él ve su misión también como una forma de hacer "mi raza celosa", lo que llevara a algunos de ellos de ser salvado. La conversación de los gentiles, que han desobedecido a Dios, Pero ahora habéis alcanzado misericordia", servirá para llevar a los Judíos que han es obedecido también "obtener misericordia". La desobediencia de Judío y gentiles resultados en la misericordia de Dios extendida a todos. El encuentro de Jesús con la mujer cananea le encuentra en territorio extranjero, entre los gentiles. La mujer se acerca a Jesús pidiendo ayuda para su hija, que "esta atormentada por un demonio". Ella es persistente en su petición, incluso en la cara de rechazo preliminar de Jesús: "No soy enviado sino a las ovejas perdidas de la casa de Israel." Pero ella le recuerda que "hasta los perros comen las migajas que caen de la mesa de sus amos". Ella no está tratando de quitarle nada a los Judíos; ella esta simplemente buscando ayuda para su hija. Su perseverancia da sus frutos, ya que Jesús cura a su hija en respuesta a su gran fe. La gracia y la misericordia de Dios son para todos los que lo buscan. *Para reflexionar: ¿Cómo una mentalidad de "nosotros contra ellos" refleja una actitud contraria al cristianismo? ¿Quiénes son los que se pasan por alto hoy en día, y como podemos como Iglesia ayudarles a experimentar la gracia y la misericordia de Dios?*
