## Spiritual Notes:

The books of Chronicles provide us with a second look at many of the key events in Israel's history. Written at the end of the fifth century BC, it covers the same era as the books of Samuel and Kings, but from a different perspective and with an emphasis on God's involvement in human history. The Greek name of the text, *Paralipomenon* (meaning "things omitted or passed over"), gives us some idea of the intention of the author. Today's text is concerned with the conquest of the nation of Judah at the hands of the Babylonians and the people's eventual release and return from exile as brought about by "Cyrus, king of Persia." Cyrus, conqueror of Babylon, declares that "the Lord... has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, and he orders the exiles to return home and carry out this command. For the chronicler, both the exile and the return are divine actions within human history. John's Gospel is filled with contrasting images: death and life, light and darkness, spirit and flesh, truth and lies. In today's text Jesus says, "the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness." In Jesus God acts definitively in human history, sending "his only Son" in order that we might share in "eternal life." Like biblical Israel, we are given a choice; whether we choose to believe or not, there are consequences. In Ephesians, we hear again, about "the great love God has for us." This love is manifest in the fact that God "brought us to life with "Christ" despite our sins. Our salvation is not a result of our won good works but is grace: the gift of God made manifest in Jesus. God acted in history in Jesus Christ to free us from the power of sin and death and to offer us salvation. Our task, as children of the light, is to embrace that light and receive God's gift.

*For reflection: Do I strive to walk in the light of Christ, or do I sometimes prefer the shadows? Have I ever failed to sense God's presence in my life? How does taking a second look sometimes help to clarify things?*

#### Notas Espirituales:

Los libros de Crónicas nos dan una segunda mirada a muchos de los eventos clave en la historia de Israel. Escrito a finales del siglo V AC, que cubre la misma época que los libros de Samuel y Reyes, pero desde una perspectiva diferente y con un énfasis en la participación de Dios en la historia humana. El nombre griego del texto, las Crónicas (que significa "cosas omitidas o sobre pasadas"), nos da una idea de la intención del autor. El texto de hoy tiene que ver con la conquista de la nación de Judá a manos de los babilonios y eventual liberación y el regreso de la gente del exilio como comprados por "Ciro, rey de Persia." "Ciro, el conquistador de Babilonia, declara que "el Señor... también me encargó para construirle una casa en Jerusalén," y ordena a los exiliados a regresar a casa y llevar a cabo este mandato. Para el cronista, tanto el exilio y el regreso son acciones divinas dentro de la historia humana. En el Evangelio de Juan está lleno de imágenes contrastantes: la muerte y la vida, la luz y la oscuridad, el espíritu y la carne, la verdad y la mentira. En el texto de hoy, Jesús dice, "la luz vino al mundo, pero la gente prefiere las tinieblas." En Jesús Dios actúa definitivamente en la historia humana, enviando "su Hijo único" con el fin de que podamos compartir en la "vida eterna." Al igual que Israel bíblico se nos da una elección; si elegimos creer o no, hay consecuencias. En Efesios oímos de nuevo sobre "el gran amor (Dios) tenía para nosotros." Este amor se manifiesta en el hecho de que Dios "nos dio vida con Cristo" a pesar de nuestros pecados. Nuestra salvación no es el resultado de nuestras propias buenas obras, pero es la gracia: "el don de Dios" manifestado en Jesús. Dios actuó en la historia en Jesucristo, para liberarnos del poder del pecado y de la muerte y para ofrecernos la salvación. Nuestra tarea, como hijos de la luz, es abrazar la luz y recibir el regalo de Dios.

**Para reflexionar:** ¿Me esfuerzo por caminar en la luz de Cristo, o Por qué algunas veces prefiero las sombras? ¿Alguna vez he dejado de sentir la presencia de Dios en mi vida? ¿Cómo tomar una segunda mirada a veces ayudar a aclarar las cosas?
