## **Spiritual Notes:**

A recurring theme in Exodus is the grumbling or murmuring of the people against Moses and the Lord. In today's text, they accuse Moses and Aaron of having brought them out of Egypt "into this desert to make the whole community die of famine!" In response, the Lord sends them quail and manna, bread from heaven, not only to provide for them but also to test them, to see whether they follow my instructions. These gifts from heaven serve to prove to the Israelites, that I, the Lord, am Your God. They have just departed Egypt, a land with hundreds of gods, but it is the Lord who cares for them, and who invites them into an exclusive relationship. Today's Gospel continues the story of the loaves and fish as the disciples follow Jesus to Capernaum, across the sea from where they were fed. He challenges their motive for following Him, claiming that they are seeking Him, because you at the loaves and were filled. More important than the food He gave them, which is food that perishes, is the food that endures for eternal life. They compare the food He gave them to the manna their ancestors ate in the desert. But Jesus tells them that it is not Moses but my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. Their response is to ask Him to give us this bread always. The Author of Ephesians encourages his audience to no longer live as the Gentiles do. Embracing the Christian faith, they are called to put away the old self and put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth.

*For reflection: Do I sometimes forget the ways God has blessed me in the past? Do I pray for a deeper hunger for the bread from heaven?*

The intention for the Soup Kitchen is to serve God's children in need: the poor in spirit, as well as the needy.

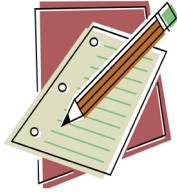

#### Notas Espirituales:

Un tema repetido en las quejas o murmuraciones del pueblo contra Moisés y el Señor. En el texto de hoy acusan a Moisés y Aarón de haberlos sacado de Egipto "a este desierto para que toda la comunidad muera de hambre!" En respuesta, el Señor les envía codornices y maná, "pan del cielo," no sólo para proporcionar para ellos sino también para poner a prueba a ellos, "para ver si siguen mis instrucciones." Estos regalos del cielo sirven para demostrar a los israelitas "que yo, soy el Señor, su Dios." Acaban de partir a Egipto, una tierra con cientos de dioses, pero es el Señor quien se preocupa por ellos y que los invita a una relación exclusiva.

El evangelio de hoy continúa la historia de los panes y los peces como los discípulos siguen a Jesús a Cafarnaúm, "a través del mar" de donde fueron alimentados. Él desafía su motivo para seguirlo, alegando que lo están buscando "porque han comido de los panes hasta saciarse." Más importante que la comida que les dio, que es "la comida que perece," es "el alimento que permanece para la vida eterna." Comparan la comida que les dio el maná a sus antepasados que comieron en el desierto. Pero Jesús les dice que no es Moisés sino "mi Padre (que)nos da el verdadero pan del cielo." Su respuesta es para pedirle que "nos dan siempre de ese pan."

El autor de Efesios alienta a su pueblo "ya no viven como los gentiles." Abrazar la fe cristiana, se les llama a "poner distancia del viejo hombre" y "revestir el nuevo hombre, creado según Dios en la justicia y santidad de la verdad."

**Para reflexionar:** ¿Me olvido a veces las formas en que Dios me ha bendecido en el pasado? ¿Rezo por un hambre más profundo para el pan del cielo?
