Spiritual Notes:

God's servant Isaiah suffers greatly but trusts in the Lord, "my help." His confidence in God allows him to suffer all sorts of indignities: "I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard." For the early Christians, this text foreshadowed Jesus' suffering. But through the ages others have also suffered because of their vocation. This "Servant Song," along with the others in Isaiah, serves to encourage those who suffer to persevere because God has promised to rescue them. Caesarea Philippi is at the northern border of Israel. After today's episode Jesus will begin his journey toward Jerusalem, the city of his death. The tone of Mark's Gospel changes as Jesus, declared "the Christ" by Peter, predicts his coming Passion, death, and resurrection as part of God's will for him. Peter rejects this idea but is rebuked by Jesus because he is "thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." The disciples will only come to understand after the resurrection. James reminds us that faith and works are found together in the lives of believers: "Faith... if it does not have works, is dead." Our good works are not the source of our salvation but rather are an indication that our faith is alive. Faith is more than giving intellectual assent to a system of beliefs; it is embracing a way of life that is concerned with the welfare of others. James goes on to say that the "faith of Abraham was completed by the works." Our faith in Jesus, who suffered for us, should lead us to perform good works out of gratitude to God. Our works are not the cause of our faith but an indication of it.

For reflection: How do I look at suffering in my life? In the life of others? What does the fact that Jesus chose to suffer for us mean to me?



Notas Espirituales:

El siervo de Dios en Isaías sufre mucho, pero confía en el SEÑOR, "me ayuda." Su confianza en Dios permite que sufra toda clase de humillaciones: "Di mi cuerpo a los que me golpeaban, mis mejillas a los que me tiraban de la barba." Para los primeros cristianos, este texto anunciaba el sufrimiento de Jesús. Pero a través de las edades otros también han sufrido a causa de su vocación. Esta "Canción Siervo," junto con los otros en Isaías, sirve para animar a los que sufren a perseverar porque Dios ha prometido rescatarlos.

Cesárea de Filipo se encuentra en la frontera norte de Israel. Tras el episodio de hoy Jesús comenzará su viaje hacia Jerusalén, la ciudad de su muerte. El tono de los cambios Evangelio de Marcos como Jesús, declarado "el Cristo," de Pedro, predice su Pasión venida, muerte y resurrección como parte de la voluntad de Dios para él. Pedro rechaza esta idea, pero es reprendido por Jesús porque él "no está pensando como lo hace Dios, sino como lo hacen los hombres." Los discípulos sólo llegan a entender después de la resurrección.

Santiago nos recuerda que la fe y las obras se encuentran juntos en la vida de los creyentes: "La fe ..., si no tiene obras, está muerta." Nuestras buenas obras no son la fuente de nuestra salvación, sino más bien son una indicación de que nuestra fe está viva. La fe es más que una mente sabia un método de creencias; se está adoptando una forma de vida que se preocupa por el bienestar de los demás. Jacobo llega a decir que la "fe (de Abraham) se completó con las obras." Nuestra fe en Jesús, que sufrió por nosotros, nos debe llevar a hacer buenas obras por gratitud a Dios. Nuestras obras no son la causa de nuestra fe, sino una indicación de ello.
