Spiritual Notes:

Returning to Ordinary Time, we encounter today's text from Isaiah, who envisions a joyful time for Zion, the mountain of Jerusalem, which represents the chosen people. Whereas earlier the Lord had spoken words of judgment against the people, now the prophet's words speak of renewal and restoration: "Nations shall behold your vindication." After having returned from exile, they are promised a time of renewal, "for the Lord delights in you." Paul reminds the Corinthians that "there are different kinds of spiritual gifts, but all are given by the same Spirit." Each "is given for some benefit." In their community, some felt that their gifts were superior to the gifts of others. Paul challenges them to view these gifts as beneficial to the community, using them for the common good. After all, they are "the manifestation of the Spirit" and so should bring about good results. The same is true of us today; our gifts should benefit the community, helping it to grow as a living witness to the gospel. Tradition remembers the miracle at the wedding in Cana as Jesus' first miracle, but it is only remembered in John's text. For John it is the first of only seven miracles or "signs" performed by Jesus, which serve to reveal "his glory" and inspire faith in his disciples. That Jesus performed this miracle at the wedding shows us that Jesus goes out to meet people where they are; he does not wait for them to come to him.

For reflection: What gift do I have that can serve the church? Do I sense the presence of Christ in the everyday moments of life or just in the religious moments?

The Jubilee Year of Mercy

December 8, 2015 – November 20, 2016

"It is a favorable time to heal wounds, a time to offer everyone the way of Forgiveness and Reconciliation." ~ Pope Francis

The fifth corporal work of mercy – to visit the sick. In the Old Testament we learn that God even sends angels to visit the sick, when the Archangel Raphael was sent to heal Tobit. Mark tells us about Jesus visiting the sick, "Immediately upon leaving the synagogue, he entered the house of Simon and Andrew with James and John. Simon's mother-in-law lay ill with a fever, and the first thing they did was to tell him about her. He went over to her and grasped her hand and helped her up, and the fever left her." When the Centurion asked Jesus to cure his servant of a severe illness, Jesus indicated he would visit the sick person and cure him. The Centurion's great faith in Jesus encouraged Jesus to cure the servant from a distance. As disciples of Jesus, we are called upon to visit the sick, not only family members, but other Catholics and non-Catholics. Some ways we can do this is by sending Mass cards to the sick thereby obtaining God's grace for healing, visiting those who are confined in hospitals and recovery facilities, visiting the sick who are confined to their homes and assisting in providing for their needs, helping family members in supporting sick family members.

Mercy grows within us as we reflect on how God has been merciful to us.

Please remember in your prayers, all the sick, homebound, and recovering in our parish. Also, pray for those coping with physical or mental conditions.



Notas Espirituales:

Volviendo al Tiempo Ordinario, nos encontramos con el texto de hoy de Isaías, que contempla un tiempo de gozo por Sión, el monte de Jerusalén, que representa al pueblo elegido. Mientras que las palabras anteriormente el SEÑOR había dicho de juicio contra el pueblo, ahora las palabras del profeta hablan de renovación y restauración: "Las naciones podrán ver tu justicia." Después de haber regresado del exilio, se les promete un tiempo de renovación, " porque el Señor se deleita en ti."

Pablo recuerda a los corintios que "hay diversidad de dones espirituales," pero todos se dan por "el mismo Espíritu." Cada don "se da para el bien común." En su comunidad, algunos sintieron que sus regalos eran superiores a los dones de los demás. Pablo les reta a ver estos dones como beneficio para la comunidad, usarlos para el bien común. Después de todo, ellos son "la manifestación del Espíritu," y así deben lograr buenos resultados. Lo mismo puede decirse de nosotros hoy en día; nuestros dones deben beneficiar a la comunidad, ayudando a que crezcan como un testimonio vivo del Evangelio.

La tradición recuerda el milagro en las bodas de Caná como el primer milagro de Jesús, pero sólo se le recuerda en el texto de Juan. Para Juan es el primero de los siete milagros o "señales" realizados por Jesús, que sirven para revelar "su gloria" e inspirar la fe en sus discípulos. Jesús hizo este milagro en una boda nos muestra que Jesús sale al encuentro de la gente donde está; él no espera a que vengan a él.

Para reflexionar: ¿Qué regalo tengo que pueda servir a la iglesia? ¿Tengo la sensación de la presencia de Cristo en los momentos diarios de la vida o simplemente en los momentos religiosos?
