Spiritual Notes:

Today's text from Isaiah is attributed to the anonymous prophet referred to as Second Isaiah. Writing near the end of the Babylonian exile, he provides a message of hope. As happened in the Exodus story, once again the Lord, "opens a way in the sea, a path in the mighty waters." They are about to be brought back to the Promised Land. "In the desert I make a way," the Lord says, a way to bring "the people whom I formed for myself" back to their homeland. Paul tells the Philippians that all else is as nothing when compared to "the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus." But his faith is part of the process; he has not "already taken hold of it, or already attained perfect maturity," he writes, "I continue my pursuit toward the goal, the prize of God's upward calling." Like Paul, we are called to continually pursue this goal as we strive to live out our faith more fully each day. The story of the woman caught in adultery is another encounter between Jesus and "the scribes and the Pharisees," who are frequently depicted in the Gospel tradition as opponents of Jesus. The fact that she "had been caught in adultery" means there is no doubt about her guilt. By bringing her to Jesus, they are testing him "so that they could have some charge to bring against him." But Jesus reminds them that we all stand under God's judgment, for we are all sinners. His words to them, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her," challenge them and lead to their walking away "one by one, beginning with the elders." His judgment on her is not to condemn but to forgive and to love. It is the same judgment he offers us in his suffering and death.

For reflection: Do I appreciate the fact that my personal spiritual development is in constant need of growth and strengthening? What has been my response to experiencing Christ's judgment of love and forgiveness?

The Jubilee Year of Mercy December 8, 2015 - November 20, 2016

Spiritual Works of Mercy: Fourth spiritual work of mercy - comforting the afflicted. When Jesus entered the town of Naim, he saw a dead man being carried out, the only son of a widow. "The Lord was moved with pity upon seeing her and said to her, 'Do not cry.' Then he stepped forward and touched the litter; at this, the bearers halted. He said, 'Young man, I bid you get up.' The dead man sat up and began to speak. Then Jesus gave him back to his mother." (Lk. 7:13-15) In our daily lives, we interact with many people suffering afflictions: failing marriages, children in trouble, illness, financial problems, death of loved ones, loss of a job or addictions. Jesus gave us an example at Naim of how we, his followers, should act toward those undergoing an affliction. He did not shake his head and say "too bad" and then proceed on his way. He did not wait until the widow asked for help. Jesus reached out to her with sincere sympathy for her burden. For us, it could be the afflicted person only wants someone to listen to them unburden themselves. Or it may be that they need assurance from us that they can eventually work through the affliction, returning to a more normal life. Or they may need some kind of support during their personal crisis that we can offer. Comforting the afflicted calls for sacrifice on the part of the giver - that is what Jesus and his followers are about. St. Paul tells us, "He comforts us in all our afflictions and thus enables us to comfort those who are in trouble, with the same consolation we have received from him" (2 Cor 1:4).

Please remember in your prayers, all the sick, homebound, and recovering in our parish. Also, pray for those coping with physical or mental conditions. Please include all those on our prayer lists who have asked for our prayers, and those who have no one to pray for them.

As Mary recalls the incredible mystery of her life with Christ, Peter rediscovers the truth: He is not leading. He is following.

Notas Espirituales:

El texto de hoy de Isaías se refiere al profeta anónimo conocido como Segundo Isaías. La escritura casi al final del exilio de Babilonia, que ofrece un mensaje de esperanza. Como sucedió en la historia del Éxodo, una vez más el Señor "abre un camino en el mar, y un sendero en las aguas impetuosas." Están a punto de ser llevados de vuelta a la tierra prometida. "En el desierto abriré un camino." El SEÑOR dice - una manera de llevar "Este pueblo que yo he creado para mí" regresaron a su tierra. Pablo le dice a los filipenses que todo lo demás es como nada en comparación con "el bien supremo de conocer a Cristo Jesús." Pero su fe es parte de un proceso; no "considero que todavía no lo he logrado, o ... ya he alcanzado la madurez perfecta." Él escribe, "continúo mi búsqueda hacia la meta, al premio del llamamiento de Dios hacia arriba." Al igual que Pablo, estamos llamados a perseguir este objetivo continuamente mientras nos esforzamos por vivir nuestra fe más plenamente cada día. La historia de la mujer sorprendida en adulterio es otro encuentro entre Jesús "los escribas y los fariseos," que se representan con frecuencia en la tradición evangélica como adversarios de Jesús. El hecho de que ella "había sido sorprendida en adulterio" significa que no hay duda sobre su culpabilidad. Trayéndola a Jesús, lo están poniendo a prueba "para que pudieran tener algún cargo y ponerlo en contra de él." Pero Jesús les recuerda que todos estamos bajo el juicio de Dios, porque todos somos pecadores. Sus palabras para ellos- "Aquel de nosotros que esté sin pecado sea el primero en arrojar la piedra contra ella" - desafiarlos y conducir a su caminar lejos "uno a uno, comenzando por los ancianos." Su juicio sobre ella no es condenar, sino para perdonar y amar. Es el mismo juicio que nos ofrece en su sufrimiento y muerte. **Para la reflexión:** ¿Me agrada el hecho de que mi desarrollo espiritual personal está en constante necesidad de crecimiento y fortalecimiento? ¿Cuál ha sido mi respuesta a experimentar el juicio del amor y el perdón de Cristo?
