Spiritual Notes:

In Acts, Peter's proclamation of the good news to the household of Cornelius acknowledges that "God shows no partiality. While he is speaking, "the holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word." These people are gentiles and they will be the first gentiles to be baptized. Christ died for all of us, and His resurrection is a promise of the new life God offers to "everyone who believes in Him." We are called witness to this by our words and actions. Writing to the Corinthians, Paul reminds them that Baptism is not a guarantee of eternal life. Some risk losing the gift because they have fallen into sin. This "little yeast" can leaven "all the dough" and so is a danger to the community at large. Paul exhorts them to "clear out the old yeast." Easter is a time to renew ourselves and reaffirm our faith in God's power to save us and make all things new. In the Gospel, Mary Magdalene's visit to the tomb "while it was still dark" sets the stage for a new beginning. Jesus had been entombed in a garden reminiscent of the story of the Fall in Genesis 3. Jesus' resurrection occurs "on the first day of the week." In the resurrection, God is recreating that "they have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put Him" suggests that even Jesus' closest followers were not anticipating the resurrection. She thinks the body has been stolen. In the visit of Peter and "the other disciple," we learn that the empty tomb finds meaning only through the lens of faith. Christ is risen! He is truly risen!

For Reflection: Do I believe the Gospel is for all people or just a select group? What meaning does Jesus' resurrection give to my life?

The Jubilee Year of Mercy

Spiritual Works of Mercy: Sixth spiritual work of mercy - forgiving injuries. Because original sin has damaged us so, truly forgiving injuries often becomes an obstacle in our spiritual growth and relationship with Jesus. But this obstacle must be overcome and removed. "Then Peter came up and asked him, "Lord, when my brother wrongs me, how often must I forgive him? Seven times? "No," Jesus replied, "not seven times; I say, seventy times seven times." (Mt. 19:21-22) Our forgiving others who have injured us in some way is necessary if we wish God to forgive us. In the Lord's Prayer, we say "and forgive us the wrong we have done as we forgive those who wrong us." (Mt. 6:12) Jesus makes it clear that our forgiving others cannot simply be one of lip-service. He sternly tells us, "My heavenly Father will treat you in exactly the same way unless each of you forgives his brother from his heart." (Mt. 18:35) Refusal to forgive becomes a burden for us that festers and draws us into ever greater sin. Hanging on the cross, Jesus asked the Father concerning those who brutalized him, "Father, forgive them; they do not know what they are doing." (Lk. 23:34) Jesus meant that forgiveness for us, too.

Peter Clore attended Sacred Heart School and was a 2006 graduate of Tuscarawas Central Catholic. He studied for a time at the Pontifical College Josephinum and later joined the Marines. Peter died in May, 2011, while on active duty in Afghanistan. Peter was a Certified Explosives Detector Dog Handler, a position that put him ahead of his unit as they made their patrol. He was shot by small-arms fire.

In memory of Peter, this scholarship recognizes a student for outstanding contribution to the Catholic Identity of TCC. The ideal honoree is a gentle leader who is active in parish life, contributes to the religious dimension of the school, and participates willingly in service to others. Consideration will also be given to a student who is active in diocesan youth ministry activities.

Any staff member, parent, student, or friend of the school may submit nominations for this honor for students who will attend TCC as sophomores, juniors or seniors. The nomination should include the student's name and a brief narrative description of why the student is a worthy candidate for this honor. Nominations must be received by April 15, 2016.
