Spiritual Notes:

In Acts, at the synagogue of Antioch in Pisidia, Paul and Barnabas gain many followers as a result of their preaching. But an even larger number reject their word, so the missionaries turn their attention to the gentiles. Paul sees this as part of God's plan God has made him "a light to the Gentiles, and instrument of salvation to the ends of the earth." This is a major turning point in the history of Christianity: it shows that the Gospel is meant for all people, not just the chosen people of Israel. The whole world is now the Gospel's intended audience. In today's text from Revelation, the seer has a vision of "a great multitude, which no one could count" standing 144,000 encountered elsewhere in the text and indicate that God's offer of salvation is without limit. The seer's heavenly guide informs him that this countless multitude will be sheltered by God, and they will not hunger or thirst anymore. They will share in the victory of the Lamb forever. In today's Gospel, Jesus the good shepherd promises that His flock will share eternal life. They shall never perish, He promises. My sheep hear my voice, I know them, and they follow me. We will see this fulfilled later when Mary Magdalene, thinking that the risen Christ is the gardener, comes to recognize Him when He calls her by name. It is important for us, the flock of God, to attune our ears to His voice so that when He calls us we will know and follow it.

For Reflection: Do I accept the fact that God desires everyone to be save, even those I don't like or consider enemies? Are there things in my life that prevent me from hearing the Shepherd's voice and following it?

Holy Year of Mercy: The Beatitudes are the promises of happiness made by Jesus to those who faithfully accept His teaching, faithfully follow His example, and actively accept and use the graces Jesus gives us to live the beatitudes. Jesus taught these beatitudes in the Sermon on the Mount (Mt. 5:3-11). They are expression of the New Covenant, where happiness is assured already in this life, provided a person totally gives himself to the imitation of Christ. The Ten Commandments are about avoiding evil actions that are hostile to love and make peaceful life on earth impossible. The Beatitudes are complementary to the Ten Commandments, calling us to be new people living in a new way. They call us to live a life far more excellent than what the Ten Commandments require. The Beatitudes are first of all portraits of Jesus Christ Himself (CCC1717). Jesus tells us, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life..." (Jn. 14:6) In the Beatitudes, we find the grace-filled way, the truth and the life. The Beatitudes answer the universal call to holiness. If we incorporate the Beatitudes into our daily living, we become like Christ and are filled with His holiness.

Mercy grows within us as we reflect on how God has been merciful to us.



En el texto de hoy del Apocalipsis, el que ve tiene la visión de "una gran multitud, la cual nadie podía contar" de pie 144,000 se encuentra en otra parte del texto e indica que la oferta de la salvación de Dios no tiene límites. La Guía celestial del profeta le informa que esta multitud innumerable será protegida por Dios, y ellos no tendrán hambre ni sed. Ellos compartirán la victoria del Cordero para siempre. En el evangelio de hoy, Jesús el buen pastor de su rebaño, promete que va a compartir la vida eterna, y no perecerán jamás, Mis ovejas escuchan mi voz, yo las conozco, y ellas me siguen. Veremos esto más adelante, cuando María Magdalena piensa que el Cristo resucitado es el jardinero que viene a reconocerlo cuando él la llama por su nombre. Es importante para nosotros, el rebaño de Dios, para afinar nuestros oídos a la voz y cuando nos llame sabremos seguirlo. Para reflexionar: ¿Acepto el hecho de que Dios anhela que todos nos salvemos, incluso aquello que no me gusta o considero enemigos? ¿Hay cosas en mi vida que me impiden oír la voz del Pastor y después seguirlo?
