## Spiritual Notes:

Abraham's visitors, interpreted by many Christian commentators as the Trinity, give him an opportunity to practice his hospitality. The author tells us that it was the Lord who appeared to him, but Abraham does not seem to recognize his identity; he refers to him as "sir." His offer of a little food turns into an elaborate feast. This text illustrates that he has become a man of means and that he is a generous host. The passage concludes with the promise of a son born to Sarah within a year. We should not view this as a reward for Abraham's generosity, but as another episode in the working out of God's promise to Abraham made earlier in Genesis. Writing to the Colossians, Paul says that he unites his sufferings with those of Christ "on behalf of his body, which is the church." God has chosen to make known in Paul's day the mystery hidden so that Jew and gentile alike might come to know the message and person of Christ, who died for our sins. The story of Martha and Mary in Luke's text shows us two types of disciples. Martha is the disciple who is busy with all the chores of hospitality. In some ways, she is like Abraham and Sarah in today's first reading. But Mary has chosen the better part in focusing on listening to the Lord's words. The message is not that we should avoid the obligations of hospitality, but that we are called to have balance in our lives. There is a time for work and a time for listening. Too often a hostess fails to visit with her guests because she is too busy worrying about many things. Martha runs the risk of missing the better part.

*For Reflection: What is my attitude toward the stranger among us? Do I strive to have a sense of balance in my life between Christian deeds and contemplation? What would my life be like if one of those dimensions were lacking?*

## The Jubilee Year of Mercy December 8, 2015-November 20, 2016

**Holy Year of Mercy: Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) – SIN.** All of us are sinners. Only two people in the whole human race never sinned: Jesus (a divine person) and His Mother Mary (a human person). God has revealed to us in His commandments the human behavior that offends

Him (Ex. 20: 1-17, Deut. 5: 6-21). Sin is a failure in genuine love for God and neighbor. It turns our hearts away from God's love for us. All sin has its roots in the sin of pride. (refer to the Catechism of the Catholic Church 1849, 1850) Jesus declares, "I give you my assurance, everyone who lives in sin is the slave of sin." (Jn. 8:34) Venial sin causes damage in our relationship with God but does not cause a complete break in that relationship. It is a mistake for us to view venial sin as merely a little, minor, meaningless sin. God is still very offended by it. John the Apostle instructs us about sin, "Anyone who sees his brother sinning, if the sin is not deadly, should petition God, and thus life will be given to the sinner. This is only for those whose sin is not deadly. There is such a thing as deadly sin; I do not say that one should pray about that. True, all wrong doing is sin, but not all sin is deadly." (1 Jn. 5:16-17) The Church calls deadly sin mortal or grave sin. Mortal sin causes a complete break in one's relationship with God. With mortal sin, the soul is spiritually dead. Some examples of mortal sin are missing Sunday Mass without a serious reason, abortion, sexual relations outside the sacrament of marriage, abuse or serious neglect of children, and viewing pornography.

*Mercy grows within us as we reflect on how God has been merciful to us.*

#### Notas Espirituales:

Los Visitantes de Abraham, interpretados por muchos comentaristas cristianos como la Trinidad, le da una oportunidad de practicar su hospitalidad. El autor nos dice que era el Señor que se le apareció, pero Abraham no parece reconocer su identidad; sino que se refiere a él como "señor." Su oferta de un poco de comida se convierte en una fiesta preparada. Este texto muestra que se ha convertido en un hombre justo y que es un anfitrión generoso. El pasaje termina con la promesa de un hijo nacido de Sara en un año. No debemos ver esto como una recompensa por la generosidad de Abraham, sino como un episodio más en el trabajo de la promesa de Dios a Abraham que realizo a principios en el Génesis. Al escribir a los Colosenses, Pablo dice que él une sus sufrimientos a los de Cristo "en la parte de su cuerpo, que es la iglesia." Dios ha escogido para dar a conocer en los días de Pablo "el misterio oculto" de modo que Judíos y gentiles por igual puedan llegar a conocer el mensaje y la persona de Cristo, que murió por nuestros pecados. La historia de Marta y María en el texto de Lucas nos muestra dos tipos de discípulos. Marta es el discípulo que está ocupada con todos los quehaceres de la casa. En cierto modo, ella es como Abraham y Sara en la primera lectura de hoy. Pero María "ha elegido la mejor parte" en concentrarse a escuchar las palabras del Señor. El mensaje no es que debemos de evitar las obligaciones de nuestro hogar, sino que estamos llamados a tener balance en nuestras vidas. Hay un tiempo para trabajar y un tiempo para escuchar. Con demasiada frecuencia, los que invitan al visitante no lo atienden, ya que está demasiado ocupado y preocupado "por muchas cosas." Marta corre el riesgo de perder la mejor parte.

*Para la reflexión: ¿Cuál es mi actitud hacia el extraño entre nosotros? ¿Debo tratar de tener armonía en mi vida y ceder a las acciones cristianamente? ¿Cuál sería mi vida si yo careciera de paciencia?*
