## Spiritual Notes:

All of our texts today, illustrate the value of intercessory prayer. While the Israelites are in the wilderness, they battle with the Amalekites. Sending Joshua to lead the troops, Moses climbs to the "top of the hill" to pray for them. The battle goes Israel's way "as long as Moses kept his hands raised up." Eventually, Moses tires and must lower his arms, and the tide changes. So Aaron and Hur supported his hands, "keeping them steady till sunset" and the Israelites were successful in battle. In closing the letter to Timothy, our author writes, "proclaim the word; be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient" Proclaiming the Gospel sometimes comes at a cost, but we are called to persevere in our task, through all patience and teaching. Knowing that what we have learned is true, we remain faithful. Being rooted in Scripture, which is inspired by God, our teaching equips us for every good work. Let us strive to persevere. In Luke's text prayer is an important theme. Jesus prays before key moments in His life, setting an example for His followers and illustrating His relationship with the Father. In today's parable, Jesus encourages us to persevere in prayer. If even an unjust judge will heed the requests of the widow, will not our gracious God secure the rights of His chosen ones. But prayer is not always easy, so Jesus challenges the disciples and us asking, "When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on Earth?"

*For reflection: As Moses needed the assistance of Aaron and Hur, so to the "official prayers" of the Church need support in prayer. Do I participate in this or do I get discouraged.*

**Holy Year of Mercy:** The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is foreshadowed in Mark's Gospel. "So they went out and preached that men should repent. And they cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many that were sick and healed them." (Mk. 6:12-13) The Letter of James shows the early Church already using the sacrament. "Is there any among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven." (Jas. 5:14-15) The Church encourages the use of this sacrament when one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age. If one recovers, the sacrament may be administered again later. If one is undergoing serious surgery or those weakened by advanced age may be anointed with the sacrament. The graces that the sacrament gives are comfort, peace, and the courage to face the challenges of frailty and sickness and to resist the temptations to discouragement and despair. In this sacrament, Christ grants spiritual healing and may even grant bodily healing. Also, in this sacrament, Jesus fulfills that word which He spoke, "I was sick and you visited me." (Mt. 25:36)

#### Notas Espirituales:

Todos nuestros textos muestra hoy el valor de la oración de intercesión. Mientras los israelitas en el desierto, lucha contra los amalecitas. Salió Josué para dirigir a las tropas, Moisés sube a la "cima de la colina" y orar por ellos. La batalla sale camino de Israel "mientras Moisés tenía las manos levantadas hacia arriba." Finalmente Moisés se cansa y tiene que bajar los brazos, y cambia la marea. Entonces "Arón y Jur le sostenían las manos," manteniéndolas "firmes hasta la puesta del sol," y los israelitas tuvieron éxito en la batalla.

En el cierre de la carta a Timoteo, nuestro autor escribe: "proclamar la palabra, / ser persistente si es conveniente o inconveniente." La proclamación del Evangelio a veces tiene un costo, pero estamos llamados a perseverar en nuestra tarea," a través de toda paciencia y doctrina." Sabiendo que lo que hemos ganado es cierto, permanezcamos fieles. "Enraizada en la Escritura, que es "inspirada por Dios," nuestra enseñanza nos prepara "para toda buena obra." Esforcémonos para perseverar.

En el texto de Lucas, la oración es un tema importante. Jesús ora antes de los momentos claves de su vida, un ejemplo para sus seguidores que ilustra su relación con el Padre. En la parábola de hoy, Jesús nos anima a perseverar en la oración. Incluso un juez injusto presto atención a las peticiones de la viuda, no estaremos en la gracia de Dios "garantiza los derechos de sus elegidos" ? Pero la oración no siempre es fácil, por lo que Jesús desafía a los discípulos y a nosotros, preguntando: "cuando venga el Hijo del Hombre, ¿encontrará fe en la tierra?"

**Para la reflexión: ¿Cómo Moisés necesitaba la ayuda de Aarón y Jur, de modo que las "oraciones oficiales" de la iglesia necesitan apoyo en oración? ¿Participo en esto, o me desanimo?**
