## Spiritual Notes:

The Book of Sirach, also known as Ecclesiasticus, dates to about 200 years before Jesus. The text is concerned with religious fidelity. "Give to the Most High as he has given to you, generously," the author advises just before the text of today's reading. Throughout the Bible God is depicted as a giving, generous God: creating, calling, redeeming, forgiving, and revealing. God's act of self-revelation is an invitation to a relationship that results in blessings for us. He shows no partiality "toward the weak" but has a special concern for "the oppressed.... the orphan....the widow." In 2 Timothy, we hear that "the just judge" will give "the crown of righteousness" to those whose lives witness to their faith. God is faithful, and those whose lives have been spent in the service of the gospel, like Paul, has reason to stand firm in their faith. "The Lord...will bring me safe to his heavenly kingdom." With his "time of ...departure...at hand," Paul is confident in God's goodness. In today's parable we hear of a Pharisee who is convinced of his own goodness and a tax collector conscious of his own sinfulness. Luke tells us that Jesus "addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their won righteousness and despised everyone else." The Pharisee goes beyond this requirement of the Law; the Law requires an annual fast but he fast "twice a week." But he is blinded by his own pride, which tells him he is "not like the rest of humanity." This is his downfall, for "whoever exalts himself will be humbled." He may be keeping the Law, but he fails to love his neighbor, and is failing to do this he fails to love God as he should.

*For Reflection: How do I witness to my faith? Am I open to God's self-revelation in my life?*

**Holy Year of Mercy: Precepts of the Catholic Church.** (Catechism of the Catholic Church 2041 - 2043) Jesus, in His mercy, gave us the Catholic Church as the means for achieving our salvation. The Catholic Church has been delegated the divine power to levy binding requirements on its members. Speaking to Peter, Jesus specifically says, "I will entrust to you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; whatever you declare bound on earth shall be bound in heaven; whatever you declare loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." (Mt. 16:19) The precepts of the Catholic Church are binding requirements specifying the absolute minimum actions required of Catholics regarding the Church. In these precepts, we are reminded by the Church that Christian life requires a commitment to prayer, active participation in the liturgy and sacraments, and living a moral life. If we fall below this bare minimum level, we cannot rightly consider ourselves to be in full communion with the Catholic Church. Intentional violation of these precepts constitutes a grave matter, a mortal sin, completely breaking our relationship with God. **First Precept:** You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor. This precept tells us what must be done as a minimum in obedience to the Third Commandment (Ex. 20:8-11). Next week we will cover the remaining four precepts.

#### Notas Espirituales:

El libro de Sirácide, también conocido como Eclesiástico, se remonta alrededor de 200 años antes de Cristo. El texto se refiere a la fidelidad religiosa. "Da al Altísimo como él te ha dado/generosamente," el autor aconseja justo antes del texto de la lectura de hoy. A lo largo de la Biblia, Dios está representado como un dador, un Dios generoso: creador, llamando, redimiendo, perdonando, revelando. El acto de auto-revelación de Dios es una invitación a una relación que resulta bendiciones para nosotros. Él no hace acepción "hacia los débiles," pero tiene una especial preocupación por "los oprimidos ... el huérfano y la viuda."

En segunda de Timoteo se nos dice que "el juez justo "dará "la corona de justicia" a aquellos cuyas vidas den testimonio de su fe. Dios es fiel, y aquellos cuyas vidas se han gastado en el servicio del Evangelio, como Pablo, tiene razones para mantenerse firme en su fe. "El Señor me traerá a salvo a su reino celestial." "Con su" momento de ... partida ... cerca," Pablo es confidente en la bondad de Dios.

En la parábola de hoy nos enteramos de un fariseo que está convencido de su propia bondad y un recaudador de impuestos consciente de su propia pecaminosidad. Lucas nos dice que Jesús "dirige esta parábola/a los que estaban convencidos de su propia justicia/y desprecian a los demás." El fariseo, va más allá de los requisitos de la Ley, la Ley requiere un ayuno anual, pero el ayuna dos veces a la semana. Pero él está cegado por su propio orgullo, que le dice "no es como el resto de la humanidad." Esta es su perdición, pues "el que se enaltece será humillado." Él puede guardar la ley, pero si no ama a su prójimo, y al no hacerlo no puede amar a Dios.

**Para reflexionar:** ¿Cómo puedo ser testigo de mi fe? ¿Estoy dispuesto a la propia revelación de Dios en mi vida?
