Spiritual Notes:

The martyrdom of the mother and her seven sons in the Book of Maccabees serves as an example of heroic fidelity to God's laws; it also gives us insight into the developing belief in the life after death in biblical Judaism. Living in a time of oppression, this family undergoes torture rather than breaking God's law. Their refusal to submit so enrages the king that he orders them to be burned to death. They die the death of martyrs, "with the hope that God gives of being raised up by Him." In 2 Thessalonians, we hear a prayer that God will "encourage your hearts and strengthen them." This encouragement is important because the Christians live in a world where not all have faith, and there is a danger that they will fall away from the faith. The author's sense of urgency here indicates an expectation of Jesus' second coming in the near future. In light of this, the Thessalonians need to distinguish themselves from the perverse and wicked people among whom they live so that they will share in Christ's glory. Jesus' encounter with the Sadducees in today's Gospel is one of many episodes in which His opponents try to trip Him up. Because they accept only the Torah as inspired Scripture, and because there is no mention of resurrection in the Torah, the Sadducees reject belief in the resurrection, a belief held by the Pharisees and Jesus. Jesus' response to their question indicates that life on earth and life in heaven are different. Quoting the Torah, He reminds them that God identified Himself to Moses as the "God of Abraham" indicating that Abraham is still alive, for God "is not God of the dead, but of the living."

For Reflection: Have I experienced God's strengthening grace at moments in my life? What difference does belief in eternal life make to the way I live?

Holy Year of Mercy:

As the year of mercy draws to a close, there is a great act of mercy from God that we frequently overlook. In these troubled times when marriage, fatherhood, motherhood and the family are under attack, God the Father has given us St. Joseph who knows about marriage and family life first hand and is deeply concerned about the welfare of those who make up the family of God. St. Joseph, guardian of Jesus and virginal spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Head of the Holy Family, is the special protector of the family and spiritual father of the Church faithful. He experienced troubling doubt over Mary's pregnancy, was deeply concerned over the effect that traveling from Nazareth to Bethlehem had on his pregnant wife, was stressed over finding lodging in Bethlehem for a wife about to give birth, endured fear over having to flee to Egypt to protect the child from Herod, struggled constantly to sufficiently support a wife and child, was anxious to find a child lost for three days, and had to try to understand a child that was special in a unique way. But Joseph always had a profound trust in God and was instantly obedient to God's direction in fulfilling his responsibilities. Husbands and fathers should ask St. Joseph to assist them in the trials of their lives. Wives and mothers should always pray to St. Joseph to support their husbands and fathers of their children.

Collaborations of Priests and Laity - That within parishes, priests and lay people may collaborate in service to the community without giving in to the temptation of discouragement.



Capilla de la Virgen de Guadalupe. Todos somos bienvenidos a venerar en la Capilla de la Virgen de Guadalupe. Podemos encender una vela que permanece prendida por tres días, con una donación de \$3.00. (2 velas por \$6.00, etc.). **Por favor usar sólo las velas de la Capilla.**

Notas Espirituales:

El martirio de la madre y sus siete hijos en el libro de Macabeos sirve como ejemplo de la fidelidad heroica a las leyes de Dios, y también nos revela la creencia en el desarrollo de la vida después de la muerte en el Judaísmo bíblico. Vivir un tiempo de opresión, esta familia sufre la tortura en vez de quebrar la ley de Dios. Su negativa a rendirse lo enfurece al rey que les ordena a ser quemados a muerte, (no incluido en la lectura de hoy). Ellos mueren una muerte de mártires, con la esperanza de que Dios les dé la resurrección con él." En segunda de Tesalonicenses, escuchamos una oración para que Dios "consuele nuestros corazones y los fortalezca." Estas palabras de aliento son importantes porque los cristianos viven en un mundo en el que "no todos tienen fe," y existe el peligro de que caigan fuera de la fe. La sensación del autor que con urgencia aquí indica una expectativa de la segunda venida de Jesús en un futuro próximo. En vista de ello, los Tesalonicenses tenían la necesidad de diferenciarse de la "gente perversa y malvada," entre los que viven para compartir la gloria en Cristo. El encuentro de Jesús con los saduceos en el Evangelio de hoy es uno de muchos episodios en los que sus contrarios intentan confundirlos. Debido a que sólo aceptan la Torá, como escritura inspirada, y porque no hay ninguna mención de resurrección en la Torá, los sucesos rechazan la creencia en la resurrección, la creencia en el poder de los fariseos y Jesús. La respuesta de Jesús a la pregunta indica que la vida en la tierra y la vida en el cielo son diferentes. Citando la Torá, él les recuerda que Dios se identificó a Moisés como el "Dios de Abraham," lo que indica que Abraham todavía está vivo, porque Dios "no es Dios de muertos, sino de vivos."

Para la reflexión: ¿He experimentado fortalecer la gracia de Dios en los momentos de mi vida? ¿Qué diferencia tiene la creencia en la vida eterna que hace a la manera en que vivo?
