Spiritual Notes:

The words of the prophet Zechariah, written centuries before Christ, are filled with hope as he encourages Israel to look to the future, when Jerusalem will be restored to its true glory as the city of God. At that time, all people will come to acknowledge the God of Israel as the God of all the Earth. In a verse reflected in the Palm Sunday story, we hear of "your king... riding on an ass," entering Jerusalem amid shouts of joy and gladness. This king will eliminate weapons of warfare and "proclaim peace to the nations." This hope, long anticipated by Israel, begins to be realized in the person of Jesus, to whom "all things have been handed over." Paul reminds us that we have been given a share in "the spirit of Christ." This means that we can anticipate victory over death, because "the one who raised Christ from the dead/will give life to your mortal bodies." We share in the life of the Trinity through our Baptism, and God's spirit dwells in us, guiding us to lead holy lives. Ours is a spirit of adoption, Paul writes in a later verse, allowing us to call God "Abba, Father." It is to this Father that Jesus gives thanks and praise in today's Gospel, His words remind us that knowledge of God is not something acquired by "the wise and the learned" through their own efforts but something revealed by God "to little ones." It is our trust in God that leads us to this deeper relationship as we come to know that we are God's children. Jesus has a unique relationship with "the Father" a term found five times in today's reading, and because of that, He is able to reveal the Father to us.

For reflection: In what ways have I come to know God in my own life? How can Zechariah's hope be translated into action in today's world?

Notas Espirituales:

Las palabras del profeta Zacarías, escritas siglos antes de Cristo, están llenas de esperanza ya que alienta a Israel a mirar hacia el futuro, cuando Jerusalén será restaurado a su verdadera gloria como la ciudad de Dios. En ese momento todas las personas que vendrán a reconocer al Dios de Israel como el Dios de toda la tierra. En un versículo se refleja en la historia del Domingo de Ramos, se habla de "su rey... montado en un burro," entran en Jerusalén en medio de gritos de gozo y alegría. Este rey elimina las armas de guerra y "anuncia la paz a las naciones." Esta esperanza, tan esperada por Israel, comienza a hacerse realidad en las personas de Jesús, a quien "todas las cosas han entregado."

Pablo nos recuerda que se nos ha dado una participación en el "Espíritu de Cristo." Esto significa que podemos anticipar la victoria sobre la muerte, porque "el que resucitó a Cristo de entre los muertos / dará vida a sus cuerpos mortales." Compartimos la vida de la Trinidad a través de nuestro bautismo, y el espíritu de Dios habita en nosotros, nos guía a vivir una vida santa. El espíritu de adopción es nuestro, Pablo escribe en un verso más tarde, lo que nos permite llamar a Dios "Abba, Padre."

Es a este Padre que Jesús da gracias y alabanzas en el evangelio de hoy. Sus palabras nos recuerdan que el conocimiento de Dios no es algo que se adquiere por "los sabios y de los entendidos" a través de sus propios esfuerzos, sino algo revelado por Dios "para los más pequeños." Es nuestra confianza en Dios, que nos lleva a esta relación más profunda a medida que llegamos a saber que somos hijos de Dios.

Jesús tiene una relación única con "el Padre," un término que se encuentra cinco veces en la lectura de hoy, y debido a que él es capaz de revelar al Padre por nosotros.

Para la reflexión: ¿De qué manera he llegado a conocer a Dios en mi vida? ¿Cómo puede la esperanza de Zacarías se traduzca en acción en el mundo de hoy?
