### Spiritual Notes:

In today's Gospel, we encounter the first use of the word "church" in the Gospel. The Greek word *ecclesia* is only found here and in Matthew 18. While common in Acts and the New Testament letters, it is rare in the Gospels. Jesus usually uses the term "kingdom of heaven" or "kingdom of God," rather than "church." Caesarea Philippi was the site of a shrine to the Greek god Pan. Previously called Paneas, it was part of the territory of Herod the Great, and a shrine there was dedicated to the emperor Augustus. Herod's son, Philip, rebuilt the city and named it after Caesar Augustus and himself. It is at this location, where the Roman emperor is venerated as a god, that Jesus' identity as the "Son of the living God" is revealed and acknowledged. In the text of Isaiah, the prophet is sent by God to declare a new "master of the Palace" replacing Shebna, who has displeased the Lord. He is to be replaced by Eliakim. Like Peter in today's Gospel, Eliakim is to receive authority to rule: "I will place the key of the House of David on Eliakim's shoulder." He will be given authority over the people. Paul reminds the Romans that God's ways are "unsearchable," for we cannot know the mind of God. The mysteries of God are beyond our comprehension. Quoting the Hebrew prophets, he reminds us that no one can know "the mind of the Lord," nor can we give anything to God that would put God in our debt. It is God who has called and saved us, "To him be glory forever."

*For reflection: Why do you think Jesus preached "the kingdom" instead of "the church?" Though God's ways are "unsearchable" is there a way that Scripture and prayer can bring us closer to beginning to the understand God's mind?*



Why am I here? Where am I going? What should I be doing, once I figure all this out? We are all searching for more, and St. Joseph is providing a way for all to continue that search, regardless of where we are on our path. How? With Alpha!

Alpha is a program for all people of all backgrounds and viewpoints, and provides an opportunity to explore the purpose of life and the existence of God, while learning more about Jesus. It is designed to enhance your personal relationship with Jesus, and provide you with the tools to bring Jesus to others.

The course starts on September 11th and runs for 10 weeks. Small groups meet during the weekly sessions in a relaxed setting for a meal, to view a video, then gather in informal small groups for a laid back, discussion about the video's content.



**Capilla de la Virgen de Guadalupe.** Todos somos bienvenidos a venerar en la Capilla de la Virgen de Guadalupe. Podemos encender una vela que permanece prendida por tres días, con una donación de \$3.00. (2 velas por \$6.00, etc.). **Por favor usar sólo las velas de la Capilla.**

#### Notas Espirituales:

En el evangelio de hoy, nos encontramos con el primer uso de la palabra "iglesia" en los Evangelios. La palabra griega ekklesia se encuentra solamente aquí y en Mateo 18. Aunque frecuentemente en Hechos y las cartas del Nuevo Testamento, es raro en los Evangelios. Jesús en general se utiliza el término "reino de los cielos" o "reino de Dios" en lugar de "iglesia."

Cesárea de Filipo era el sitio de un santuario al dios griego Pan. Anteriormente llamado Paneas, era parte del territorio de Herodes el Grande, y un santuario fue dedicado al emperador Augusto. El hijo de Herodes Felipe reconstruyó la ciudad y la llamó después de César Augusto y él mismo. Es en este lugar, donde el emperador romano es venerado como un dios, que la identidad de Jesús como el "Hijo de Dios vivo" se revela y se reconoce.

En el texto de Isaías, el profeta es enviado por Dios para declarar un nuevo "maestro del palacio," en sustitución de Sebna, que ha desagradado al Señor. Él ha de ser sustituido por Eliaquim. Al igual que Pedro en el Evangelio de hoy, Eliaquim está a recibir autoridad para gobernar: "Pondré la llave de la casa de David sobre el hombro de Eliaquim." Se le dará autoridad sobre el pueblo.

Pablo recuerda a los romanos que los caminos de Dios son "insondables," ya que no podemos conocer la mente de Dios. Los misterios de Dios están más allá de nuestra comprensión. Citando a los profetas hebreos, que nos recuerda que nadie puede saber "la mente del Señor," ni podemos dar nada a Dios que ponga a Dios en deuda con nosotros. Es Dios quien ha llamado y nos ha salvado. "A Él sea la gloria por los siglos."

**Para la reflexión:** ¿Por qué crees que Jesús predicó "el reino" en lugar de "la iglesia?" Aunque los caminos de Dios son "inescrutables," ¿hay alguna manera de que la Escritura y la oración pueden acercarnos a comenzar a entender la mente de Dios?
