Spiritual Notes:

God tells Ezekiel that he has been appointed "watchman for the house of Israel." It is his task to "warn the wicked" in God's name. As a prophet of judgment, Ezekiel is called to speak words of warning to a people who have strayed from God. This warning might lead them to repentance. Many of Israel's prophets "afflicted the comfortable" and so met persecution at the hands of their own people. As a prophet living in Babylon, he preached to his fellow exiles of God's disapproval of their behavior. In today's text, part of a section that promises hope for the repentant sinner, God calls the prophet to speak his words of warning, allowing for the possibility of repentance and reconciliation. Paul reminds us today that our task as Christians is to "love one another." This is the fulfillment of the law, he says. We are called to be concerned with the welfare of our neighbor, and sometimes this means it is our task to speak prophetically as Ezekiel did, afflicting the comfortable. In today's Gospel, Jesus gives advice about dealing with those who sin against us. As the good shepherd goes after the lost sheep, so we too should seek to bring back the lost. He is not talking about correcting a stranger but rather your brother, in other words, another disciple. This instruction is only one of two in which the word "church" is found on Jesus' lips. In the text connected to the commissioning of Peter, Jesus said, "Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven." In that text, Jesus gave Peter alone the authority to bind and loose; in today's text, Jesus repeats those words, this time giving the disciples the same authority to forgive and to withhold forgiveness.

For reflection: Why should fraternal correction be a part of the Christian lifestyle? When have I been admonished for a wrong I committed? How did I react?

Our children are the most important gifts God has entrusted to us. As a volunteer, I promise to strictly follow the rules and guidelines in this Volunteer's Code of Conduct as a condition of my providing services to the children and youth of our *[parish, school, facility, diocese, etc.]*.

As a volunteer, I will:

- Treat everyone with respect, loyalty, patience, integrity, courtesy, dignity, and consideration.
- Avoid situations where I am alone with children and/or youth at Church activities.
- Use positive reinforcement rather than criticism, competition, or comparison when working with children and/or youth.
- Refuse to accept expensive gifts from children and/or youth or their parents without prior written approval from the pastor or administrator.
- Refrain from giving expensive gifts to children and/or youth without prior written approval from the parents or guardian and the pastor or administrator.
- Report suspected abuse to the pastor, administrator, or appropriate supervisor and *[the local Child Protection Services agency]*. I understand that failure to report suspected abuse to civil authorities is, according to the law, a misdemeanor.
- Cooperate fully in any investigation of abuse of children and/or youth.

As a volunteer, I will not:

- Smoke or use tobacco products in the presence of children and/or youth.
- Use, possess, or be under the influence of alcohol at any time while volunteering.
- Use, possess, or be under the influence of illegal drugs at any time.
- Pose any health risk to children and/or youth (i.e., no fevers or other contagious situations).
- Strike, spank, shake, or slap children and/or youth.
- Humiliate, ridicule, threaten, or degrade children and/or youth.
- Touch a child and/or youth in a sexual or other inappropriate manner.
- Use any discipline that frightens or humiliates children and/or youth.
- Use profanity in the presence of children and/or youth.

Notas Espirituales:

Dios le dice a Ezequiel que él ha sido nombrado "centinela de la casa de Israel." Es su tarea de "advertir al impío" en nombre de Dios. Como profeta del juicio, Ezequiel es llamado a decir palabras de advertencia para un pueblo que se han apartado de Dios. Esta advertencia podría llevar al arrepentimiento. Muchos de los profetas de Israel "afligen al comfortable" y así experimentaron la persecución a manos de su propio pueblo. La leyenda dice que Ezequiel fue asesinado por su propia gente. Como un profeta viviente en Babilonia, él predicó a sus compañeros de exilio de la desaprobación de su conducta de Dios. En el texto de hoy, parte de una sección que promete esperanza para el pecador arrepentido, Dios llama al profeta para hablar sus palabras de advertencia, lo que permite la posibilidad de arrepentimiento y reconciliación. Pablo nos recuerda hoy que nuestra tarea como cristianos es "amarnos unos a otros." Este es "el cumplimiento de la ley," dice. Estamos llamados a preocuparnos por el bienestar de nuestro prójimo, y a veces esto significa que es nuestra tarea de hablar proféticamente como lo hizo Ezequiel, afligiendo al comfortable. En el Evangelio de hoy Jesús da consejos sobre cómo tratar con los que pecan contra nosotros. Como el buen pastor va tras la oveja perdida, así también nosotros debemos tratar de traer de vuelta a los perdidos. Él no está hablando de la corrección de un extraño, sino más bien "tú hermano" en otras palabras, otro discípulo. Esta instrucción se dirige a los miembros de la iglesia. De hecho, el texto de hoy es sólo una de las dos en las que la palabra "iglesia" se encuentra en los labios de Jesús. En el texto conectado a la puesta en servicio de Pedro, Jesús dijo: "Todo lo que ates en la tierra quedará atado en el cielo." En ese texto, Jesús le dio a Pedro solo la autoridad para atar y desatar; en el texto de hoy, Jesús repite esas palabras, esta vez dando a los discípulos (en plural) de la misma autoridad para perdonar y retener el perdón.
