### Spiritual Notes:

God gives us commandments, not to fence us in but to teach us the meaning of true freedom. Freedom doesn't mean that we pick and choose which laws we obey. Paul says that we are in partnership with the Lord. God won't forgive our sins if we are bitter and unforgiving toward someone who has wronged us. Peter asks, "How many times do I have to forgive? Is seven times enough?" Jesus says that seventy-seven times would not exhaust God's mercy toward us. He tells a story of a man who owed a huge debt to his master. When the man begged for mercy, the master was moved with pity and forgave him the debt. Later, a fellow servant asked this same man to forgive a much smaller debt, yet he refused to release him. Jesus wants us to know that there are consequences to our actions. When we are spiteful toward someone, we risk retaliation. When we refuse to act with fairness, we risk vengeance. We should be mindful of our last days and set enmity aside. God is kind and merciful. If we forgive others, our prayers will be heard, our sins will be forgiven, and our lives will be redeemed from destruction.

*For Reflection: Seek reconciliation for your sins. Pray for the grace to forgive others?*
